No recognition is given for requirements/courses without documentation.

- Applicants using AP, CLEP or other test scores for a course to meet a degree requirement must submit a paper copy of the scores if the test score is not listed on the transcript. Test scores are valid for two years from the test date.
- The Pharmacy Technology Program offers students the opportunity to complete coursework online with a required lab component on campus one day a week.
- Completion of drug test will be required upon acceptance.
