### 2024-2025 Petition for Independent Status

The following information is used by the Director of Financial Aid to review a student's Petition for Independent Status. The Director will decide on an individual basis whether a student's status can be changed from dependent to independent. Meeting all of the guidelines does not mean that a petition will be granted.

### Who must provide parental information on the FAFSA?

Federal Financial Aid regulations assume that the family has primary responsibility for meeting the educational costs of a student. If you are considered a dependent student according to the financial aid definition, your aid eligibility is determined by using parent income and asset information in addition to your information. Dependent students are required by law to provide parental information and signatures to be considered for financial aid. For Federal Student Aid Programs, the North Idaho College Financial Aid Office follows the definition of an independent student as set by the Department of Education.

Under the federal definition, an undergraduate student is considered independent for 2024-2025 if they can answer "yes" to any of the following scenarios:

You were born before January 1, 2001.

You have a child or children.

You are a ward or dependent of the court, an orphan, and/or since turning age 13, you were in foster care.

You are a veteran of the United States Armed Forces or currently serving on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces for purposes other than training. You are married or separated.

You are providing significant financial support to dependents other than a spouse or child(ren).

It has been determined by a court in the state of legal residence that you are an emancipated minor or in a legal guardianship.

It was deemed that you are a homeless, unaccompanied youth or self-supporting and at risk of being homeless.

### Who may petition for independent status?

If you do not meet any of the above criteria but you believe that you should be considered independent because truly exceptional circumstances make it inappropriate to expect a parental contribution, you may complete this form to petition for a waiver of federal regulation requiring parental information. Examples of unusual circumstances are situations such as when a student's parents cannot be located, or where an otherwise dependent student has been a victim of domestic violence or abuse and is no longer able to reside with their parents. Federal regulations allow Financial Aid Administrators to use professional judgment to change dependency status to "independent" on a case-bycase basis.

**Please Note:** The U.S. Department of Education has identified four conditions that, individually or in combination with one another, <u>do not</u> qualify as "unusual circumstances" and do not merit a dependency override. Those circumstances are:

- Parents refusing to contribute to the student's education
- Parents unwilling to provide information on the application or for verification
- Parents not claiming the students as a dependent for income tax purposes and/or
- Student demonstrating total self-sufficiency.

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### **Petition for Independent Status**

In order to petition for independent status, please submit the following requirements to Cardinal Central. Allow 2-3 weeks to review your petition:

- 1. The Petition for Independent Status form
- 2. Letter of petition
- 3. Income Documentation
- 4. Supporting Documentation and/or Letter of Support

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### **REQUIREMENT 3: INCOME DOCUMENTATION**

- 1. Complete the Independent Standard Verification Form, attached to the end of the petition
- 2. Provide 2022 Tax Documentation by either:
  - a. Submitting your 2022 IRS Tax Return and 2022 W-2 Forms OR
  - b. A Verification of Non-filing Letter, if you did not file taxes in 2022\*
- 3. Provide any documentation and/or explanation of how you supported yourself in 2022 and how you plan to support yourself for the upcoming year. Include any year-to-date paystubs.

<sup>\*</sup> You will need to complete the 4506-T form to order a Verification of Nonfiling Letter from the IRS. This form can be found on the NIC Financial Aid webpage under "Forms for 2024FA, 2025SP, 2025SU." The 4506-T form must be sent directly to the IRS.

### REQUIREMENT 4: SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION AND/OR LETTER OF SUPPORT

You must provide supporting documentation that you have not been living with your parents and have not been claimed by your parents for tax filing purposes for the past two years.

Documentation may include:

- Death certificate
- Obituary
- Court documentation
- A statement from a source that is aware of your situation and can verify that you have not had any contact with your parents.
  - A statement may be from someone who is a relative or friend <u>with a copy</u> of their driver's license
  - o Or a statement may be from a third-party professional (school counselors, teachers, clergy, attorneys, therapists, etc.)
