

Apprenticeship: Careers within your reach

What do George Washington, Ben Franklin and Paul Revere have in common, other than their notable roles in the earliest days of shaping our nation?

These men were also some of America's earliest apprentices. Washington was a land surveyor, Franklin a printer and Revere was a silversmith.

The U.S. was built on apprenticeships, an ageold, ever-evolving workforce solution.

In recent years, the training model's popularity has soared as today's apprentices continue to help drive the country's economic growth. There were 950 registered active apprentices in Idaho in 2014,

according to state and national program data. By June 2024, that number had grown to 2,787. Across the state line in Washington, there were 10,755 active apprentices in 2014 and 19,105 by 2024.

The North Idaho College Workforce Training Center has long been at the forefront of this trend. The center offers apprenticeships in HVAC (heating, ventilation and air conditioning), plumbing, electrical, construction, heavy equipment, medical assistant, dental assistant, and certified nursing assistant. Apprenticeship students learn the skills of a trade through a combination of on-the-job training and related classroom instruction.

"I've seen firsthand how apprenticeships empower individuals by providing them with real-world experience, industry-specific training, and a solid foundation for long-term career growth," said NIC Workforce Training Center Executive Director Colby Mattila. "Apprentices not only learn valuable skills but also earn a wage while they train, making it a practical and rewarding career path."

These programs typically last two to four

years and conclude with the opportunity to receive certification in the trade or occupation. For apprentices in the electrical, plumbing, HVAC, construction and heavy equipment operation trades, the end goal is to earn a journeyman card. The "J-card" signifies successful completion of an apprenticeship program and that the holder has the skills, experience and knowledge to perform their trade.

"Obtaining a journeyman card not only validates a worker's skills and expertise but also opens doors to higher-paying job opportunities and greater job security," NIC Workforce Training Center Apprenticeship Manager Brenda Hamilton said.

Some of the center's apprenticeship programs offer opportunities to earn other industry-specific credentials such as those available through the National Center for Construction and Education Research. NIC Workforce Training was granted NCCER training sponsor status last year.

Customized Training and Project Manager Colleen Hoffman said the affiliation with NCCER gives NIC Workforce Training construction and heavy equipment operator students the opportunity to earn credentials that are recognized by industry nationwide.

"In addition, these NCCER credentials are verifiable online for employers who are looking to hire qualified individuals," Hoffman said.

For employers, apprenticeships have other benefits, including a significant return on investment. Many businesses pay for their apprentices' training and according to the Idaho Department of Labor, employers' average ROI is \$1.47 per \$1 invested into apprenticeship programs. Reduced turnover and the ability to provide company-

specific training while growing the talent pipeline are other employer benefits cited by the state labor department.

The NIC Workforce Training Center's apprenticeship programs evolve to meet the changing needs of industry. In doing so, these programs support the local business economy while ensuring jobs are available for apprentices.

Marty Matney, manager of the center's health careers programs, said that as the local population continues to experience rapid growth, the apprenticeship programs he coordinates are meeting an ongoing labor need while providing high-quality training for students.

"These CNA, medical assistant and dental assistant apprentices are gaining critical, hands-on experience," Matney said. "That equips them with job-specific skills and a direct pathway to employment in high-demand health care roles."

For students outside of the greater Coeur d'Alene area, you will attend live classes and in-class demonstrations via Zoom, augmented with online class assignments, quizzes, and exams. Please contact the Health Careers Department at the NIC Workforce Training Center for information on registration and in-person attendance. This program will prepare you to sit for the American Medical Technologist (AMT) Registered Dental Assistant (RDA) certification exam. Textbooks, online programs, and exam fees are included in tuition. You must be registered for this course at least two weeks prior to the start of class. This course requires regular access to a Windows-based laptop and a reliable internet connection (Chromebooks and cell phones are not compatible with the online portion of this course).



Called To Protect & Serve

NIC Workforce Training Center prepares new firefighters to serve communities

Coeur d'Alene Fire Deputy Chief Bill Deruyter encouraged the North Idaho College Workforce Training Center Firefighter 1 Academy Class of 2024 to always remember what attracted them to the world of firefighting.

"You've trained hard, honed your skills, and forged bonds that will last a lifetime. But beyond gear and techniques, remember that fire within, the passion that led you here, the why," Deruyter said during the new firefighters' May graduation ceremony at North Idaho College. "Carry it with you, for it will fuel your courage in the darkest moments."

For firefighter graduate Will Wilson, remembering his "why" won't be difficult.

"When I was a kid, 9/11 happened. I was inspired by that," Wilson said, holding his 5-month-old son, Wade.

The baby's outfit mirrored his dad's. Wade wore a tiny T-shirt like Wilson's, with a firefighter insignia on it, and the child's pants had reflective safety strips on them.

Prior to enrolling in the Firefighter 1 Academy, Wilson was an auto parts store manager with a little wildland firefighting experience. He knew he wanted more.

Wilson was grateful to have made it through training to graduation day.

"It was a long road," he said.

Wilson was recognized during the ceremony for earning grades that put him, in a tie with classmate Chandler Rogers, at the top of the class of 13 graduates.

Marty Matney, manager of the NIC Workforce Training Center's health careers and emergency services programs, said Firefighter 1 Academy students receive classroom and hands-on instruction that teaches basic firefighting skills, fire behavior, fire control techniques, fire ground safety, apparatus/ equipment operation and maintenance, HAZMAT, fire investigation, report writing, and physical fitness.

"The Firefighter 1 Academy is that first step in starting a career as a firefighter," Matney said. "Our graduates have been hired in fire departments throughout the Northwest."

Mark Daniel, another 2024 graduate, serves with the Timberlake Fire District. Already an EMT, training to become a firefighter was a natural career progression for him

Daniel was happy with his Firefighter 1 Academy experience.

"I feel like the teachers were phenomenal," Daniel said. "It was super personal."

The North Idaho College Workforce

Training Center partnered in 2010 with area fire agencies to create the Firefighter 1 Academy. The program is sponsored by the Coeur d'Alene Fire Department under the leadership of Deputy Chief Deruyter, with instructors from Coeur d'Alene Fire, Northern Lakes and Timberlake Fire Protection Districts, Kootenai County Fire and Rescue, and Spirit Lake Fire.

The academy runs from mid-January through mid-May, training up to 16 students,

preparing them for national certification testing through the International Fire Service Accreditation Congress. IFSAC certification is required for those pursuing firefighting as a career path.

Successful completion of the Firefighter 1 Academy program and certification also positions students to earn an Associate of Applied Science degree in Fire Science Technology. Graduates of the academy can transfer their certification for college credits toward the degree.

During the Firefighter 1 Academy graduation ceremony, Deputy Chief Deruyter told the newly trained recruits that firefighters are a unique breed.

"We are a family bound by more than blood. We are bound by duty, sacrifice, and unwavering support," Deruyter said. "Lean on each other, lift each other up and celebrate victories together."

He told them their impact on the lives of others matters.

Spirit Lake Fire Chief Debbie Carpenter, one of several academy instructors who spoke during the graduation ceremony, encouraged the graduates to remember it's a privilege to be the face that greets people who have called for help.

"In that moment, they didn't know who to reach out to," Carpenter said. "Don't take that lightly."

Matney said the Firefighter 1 Academy prepares students for a rewarding lifelong career.

"They will support communities," Matney said. "And these students will assist people when they need help that only a firefighter can provide."

Registration is required for the Firefighter 1 Academy. Applications for the 2025 academy must be submitted between Oct. 28 and Nov. 22.






