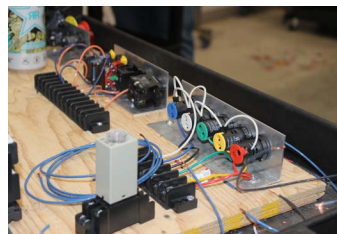
Earning While Learning Unlike traditional education, apprenticeships allow individuals to earn a wage while they train. Apprentices receive compensation that grows as their skills improve, making it

Commercial Driver's License

Class A Commercial Driver's License Training

In just a few short weeks, you could be earning an excellent living as a Class A commercial vehicle driver! This four-week course includes one week of convenient, self-paced online theory, followed by up to three weeks of fast-paced skills training in lab and open road settings. Upon completion, students take a CDL skills test with an Idaho DOT-approved tester. Course fee includes: DOT physical and drug screen vouchers; Class A theory, HazMat theory, Class A skills training; and one Idaho skills test voucher.

This online, self-paced course will prepare you to take the Idaho State Journeyman's Electrical Exam. This course does not replace the instruction portion of the apprenticeship program. Students will have access to this course for 90 days from purchase.

Plumbing Appliance Specialty Apprenticeship

The Plumbing Appliance Specialty Course is Idaho Division of Occupational and Professional Licensing (DOPL) approved. The duration of this apprenticeship consists of 72 hours of Related Technical Instruction (RTI) and 3,000 hours or 18 months of On-The-Job (OJT) training. This course is delivered online through the Canvas learning environment. The course is self-paced; the apprentice will have access to the RTI in CANVAS for 5 months once enrolled. Enrollment is open year-round. An apprentice who successfully completes the RTI with a 75% and completes the OJT requirements may test with DOPL of Idaho for licensure. Students must be 18 or older and have a copy of the 2017 Idaho State Uniformed Plumbing Code and/or 2015 Uniform Plumbing Code.

The body of water, i.e., Inland, Great Lakes, or Near Coastal, and the size of the vessel you use for your sea service determines whether you earn a 25, 50, or 100-ton Master Captain's License. This course will meet all of the requirements to obtain your Captain's License, assuming you have met the requirements for underway sea service time. In addition to the class, tuition includes books and application preparation, screening, submission, and support. Captain's License must be obtained within one year of course completion. The Master Captain's License Program is offered in partnership with US Captains Training. You will receive class email communications and class supplies mailed directly from US Captains Training.

Gain the skills and expertise to enhance the safety of workers and road users during construction, maintenance, and repair projects. This course is 100 percent safety-driven with topics including flagger qualifications and requirements, positions for safety, road user safety, flagging signals, elements of traffic control, specialty lighting, intersections, grade crossings, and short-duration and mobile work. After successful completion of this course, you will be issued a flagger card required by the Idaho Transportation Department and accepted in many other states, including Washington, Montana, and Oregon. Flagger certification is valid for three years. Minimum age required is 18 years. Fee includes Traffic Control Flagger Certification Handbook.

Assistance with Medications-Online and Skills Test

Experience the flexibility of this Assistance with Medication online format with in-person skills testing. This course is required for any unlicensed assistive personnel who is delegated the task of assisting with medications in the assisted living or residential care setting. Registration provides access to the 8-hour, online course and a process for scheduling skills testing at your site of employment. Students gain access to the online content within two to three business days of registration to help prepare for their skills test. Once the online course and online written test are completed, students may schedule and take the skills test. Skills tests are administered by a qualified RN approved by NIC Workforce Training Center. You have 30 days to complete this course after registration. Available to students who live outside a 50-mile radius from the Coeur d'Alene/Post Falls Metropolitan Area. This course satisfies the requirements of IDAPA 16.03.19.402.01. You will complete 65 successful venipunctures and should be prepared to perform blood draws on yourself, classmates, and adult volunteers. You will be expected to bring adult volunteers to class on scheduled days for additional practice; details will be provided in class. This course is required for unlicensed assistive personnel tasked with administering medications, including oral, topical, suppository, ear drops, eye drops, nasal, gastrostomy tube, and pre-mixed inhaled medications. Designed primarily for individuals caring for clients in home or assisted living settings, it is also beneficial for anyone involved in medication assistance. Understanding medication instructions and labels is a critical skill for safe healthcare practice. Early registration is recommended, ideally at least one week before the class begins. This course meets the requirements of IDAPA 16.03.19.402.01.

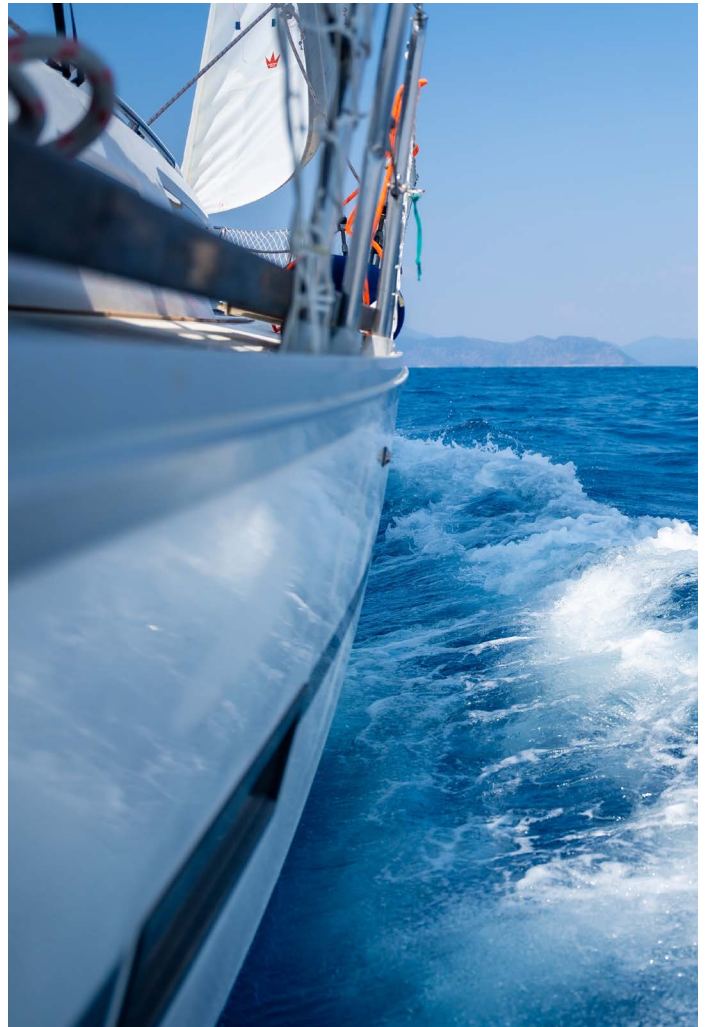

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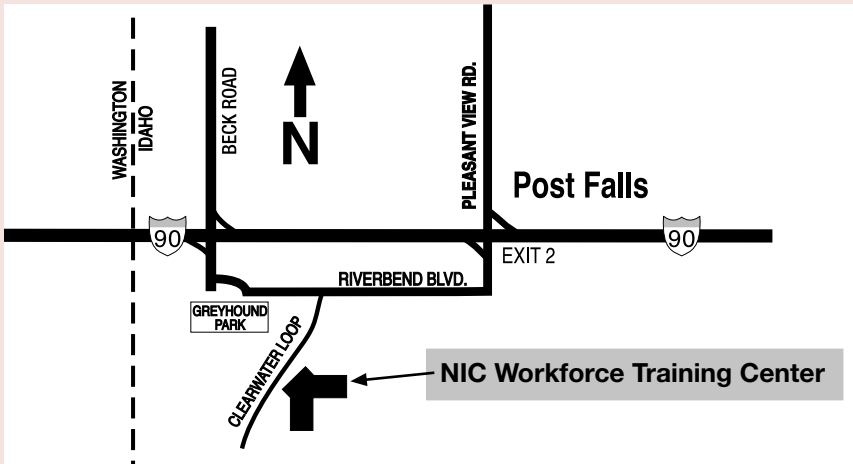

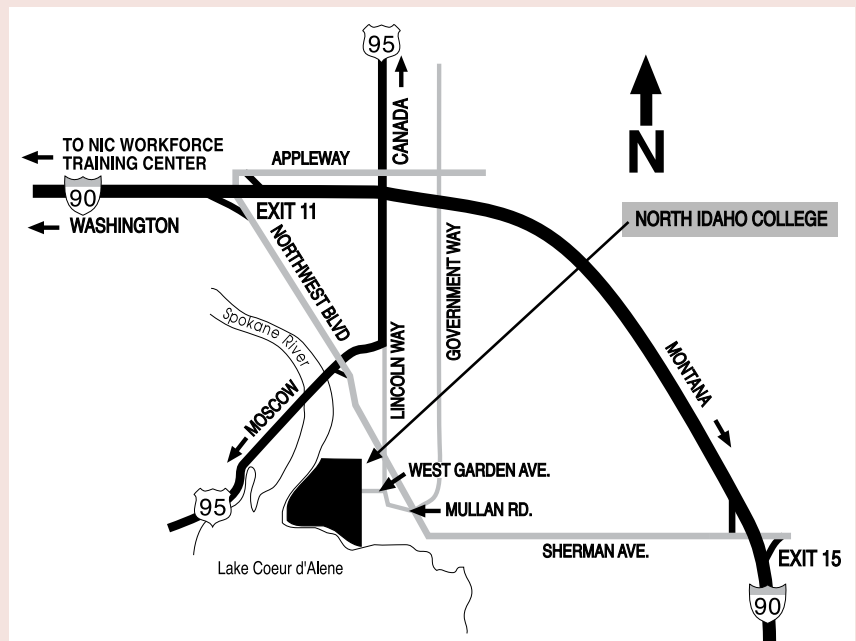
